Acceptance into the Network is based on meeting quality standards, a peer review process of the application and a commitment to the following member responsibilities.

- Annual dues/investments.
- Team participation in an annual Intermediary Institute.
- Participation in periodic team leader meetings.
- Common data collection.
- Active participation in network work groups.
- Sharing tools, materials, strategies and peer advice.

What is an Intermediary?

Intermediaries connect employers to schools and local communities. Young people need better opportunities, both in and out of school, to gain the knowledge and skills critical for success in college and careers. Employers need a skilled and motivated workforce.

Our schools can't do it alone. Yet workplace and community partners lack the time and expertise to navigate public school systems. Intermediaries solve the problem.

Intermediaries bring the right people together to make a difference. They are driven by quality, consistently measuring and improving local programs and services. They organize public and private support for the policies and funding necessary to connect the classroom with the workplace and the community.

Strategic Intermediary Functions

- **Convene** local leadership to take collective action.
- **Connect** organizations in a highly functioning system and broker services to youth and workplace partners.
- **Measure** results to improve the quality of local efforts.
- **Sustain** successful practices through supportive public policy.
